<u>Culture and Trauma - An African</u> <u>Refugee in Long Term Care</u>



Tory is an African refugee who came to Australia at 5 years old.

At 7 years old she found herself in long term care with her older sister.

Tory is the youngest of six siblings and has to adjust to being the oldest sibling in the carers home. She also has to learn to live alongside 10 animals in her new home, after being taught all her life to avoid them in Africa, so as to keep herself safe from disease.

Tory lives in care for 11 years and now sees the carers children as part of her extended sibling group.

Eventually Tory moves out of care two days before her 18th birthday, with a gentle push from her carers, into independent living with Youth Foyers.

Tory reflects on the supports offered to her, that she sometimes rejected and wishes she didn't, and the importance of having a strong open relationship with her carer.

Tory is now studying teaching, works part time and continues to be an important part of her carer's family and lives.

One in six children experience sensory processing challenges so its commonly experienced! For those of you working or who have children at home, you are welcome to join on mute with video off - we welcome participation in any format and the chat function is always available when you are muted and busy!

Each Wednesday fortnight various parents and carers come together on Zoom to learn from each other and share their challenges and lived experience in our Click and Connect meetings. Relationships Australia in South Australia (RASA) have been running Post Adoption Support Services (PASS) since 2006, and are now managing the nationwide service. Over this period, PASS has provided support to both local and intercountry adoptees, adoptive parents and families, and birth parents and families, as well as providing training to allied health professionals about adoption. Relationships Australia also runs Forced Adoption Support Services and supports those growing up in out of home care. There are many common themes! Nikki Hartman, Program Manager of Post Adoption Programs and Program Manager Time for Kids has been working in the service since 2006 and joins us as guest speaker.

Flexi-Funds

A reminder that PCA Families has Flexible Funding available to meet the extraordinary needs of children and young people subject to a Permanent Care Order, or where you are receiving DFFH care allowance and have a Family Court Order or Special Needs Adoption Order.

Flexi funds can be used for therapeutic, educational and medical services, to build skills, interests or attachment, to elevate family contact and cultural identity, to offer respite, home medication or other services like whitegoods, one off clothing, estate planning or vehicle needs eg car seats.
